

UNITED STATES ARMY CADET CORPS FISCAL YEAR 2011 HIGHLIGHTS 1 OCTOBER 2010 – 30 SEPTEMBER 2011



October 2010: Fifteen United States Army Cadet Corps (USAC) personnel attended the Association of the United States Army's Annual Meeting in Washington DC, including support of the Army 10-Miler.

October 2010: USAC personnel participated in the Kentucky Centennial Scout Jamboree in Louisville, KY with more than 10,000 scouts from five states, celebrating the 100th Anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America.

December 2010 – January 2011: Cadet Pathfinder Course returned for a 2nd year of advanced skills such as night land navigation, survival and winter operations. Twenty-four Cadets attended – a 26% increase over the inaugural course in FY10.

April 2011: USAC personnel again supported the Rolex Kentucky Three-Day Event, providing crowd control and parking support for the approximately 75,000 spectators.

June 2011: Twenty Cadets and Cadre from the Cadet Military Police Academy (CMPA) traveled to the Mid-Michigan Police Academy in Lansing, MI. This new partnership allows Cadets to participate in police academy scenario training as an additional enhancement to their Cadet training program. This partnership is also developing an articulated credit agreement whereby CMPA graduates can receive college credit toward an associate's degree in criminal justice from Lansing Community College – the degree can be completed totally online.

June – August 2011: Nearly 400 cadets from 37 states and 13 countries attended nine extensive summer Annual Training programs offered at the National Cadet Training Center (Troop Handler Academy (one week), two Basic Cadet Training sessions (two weeks), Basic Leaders Course (three weeks), Cadet Noncommissioned Officers Course (three weeks), Cadet Ranger Challenge (three weeks), Cadet Ranger School (three weeks), Army Cadet Martial Arts Program (one week) and Cadet Military Police Academy (two weeks). This year's CMPA trained 32 cadets – a 129% increase over FY10's participation.

August 2011: USAC personnel participated in the State Guard Association of the United States' Military Emergency Management Specialist (MEMS) training program as a pilot effort. This training and certification promotes the practice of emergency management and prepares USAC personnel to perform effectively in local, state and national emergency management exercises and mobilizations.

September 2011: USAC personnel attended the 2011 Civil Air Patrol Annual Conference and National Board Meeting in Louisville, KY to further work collaboratively on development of a Memorandum of Understanding between the two Cadet organizations.

Throughout FY11: Initiated an Internship program with Nicholas County School District allowing a technology intern and a building trades intern to gain valuable experience.

Throughout FY11: Developed a partnership with Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP), through Northern Kentucky Community Action Commission, to allow two senior citizens the opportunity to work in a productive environment. Also Partnered with the Department for Community Based Services (DCBS) to assist Kentucky Transitional Assistance Program (K-TAP) recipients to attain their highest potential through meaningful employment opportunities.

Throughout FY11: Planning efforts commenced for Forest Hill Military Academy, a residential preparatory school for grades 6-12 opening in fall 2012.

Throughout FY11: Approximately \$2 million in renovations to the National Cadet Training Center were accomplished during FY11. Over 70% of these funds were leveraged from in-kind or no-cost sources and labor.
