U.S. Army Cadet Corps To Hold Community Meeting Regarding Purchase of Millersburg Military Institute



HEADQUARTERS, U.S. ARMY CADET CORPS – The U.S. Army Cadet Corps (USAC) will conduct a community meeting regarding their recent purchase of the former Millersburg Military Institute (MMI) on October 2nd, at the Millersburg City Hall, 1113 Main Street. The meeting will start at 7 pm and finish by 9 pm.

Colonel Joseph M. Land, Sr., USAC’s Chief of Staff, will answer questions regarding the Army Cadet Corps and their future plans for the historic campus. USAC purchased the property on September 5th, with plans for training programs for Cadets beginning in June 2009 and a residential school within three to five years.

Founded in 1893, MMI served students for 113 years until closing in 2006. USAC will transform the 18-acre facility into its National Headquarters, as well as a National Cadet Training Center, serving Cadet programs worldwide.

USAC is an Army-oriented career exploration program for young men and women age 12-18 who are crime-free, drug-free and doing well in school. Cadets train in hometown units one weekend each month, and attend two or more weeks of military-style training each summer. Millersburg will become the home of USAC’s summer training programs, hosting several hundred Cadets throughout the year. USAC’s programs are designed to be extremely challenging and realistic, providing Cadets with a first-hand view of military life, with no obligation to enlist.

The Corps will celebrate its 100th anniversary, with plans for a combined ceremony celebrating the history of both MMI and USAC, with Cadets and alumni from across the country attending.
